The collection of pictures, almost all from the days of steam, initially focussed on North Eastern territory describing varied motive power and freight activities from within this heavy industrial region. Passenger traffic photographs covered interests around Newcastle and the LNER main line featuring Pacifics of designs by both Gresley and Raven. More southerly details focussed on major locations such as York and Darlington whilst the final phase of the programme illustrated a wide variety of traction seen on a number of more localised lines, depots and stations around North and East Yorkshire. This top quality presentation was indeed an excellent evening of entertainment.

At the end of the evening Steve sought voluntary donations from the audience in support of the A1 Steam Locomotive Trust which raised a total of some £35. Appreciative thanks were subsequently duly received from the A1 Trust.




